

The Diocese of Austin has launched a capital campaign to build St. Dominic Savio Catholic High School — a unique educational and learning environment combined with faith formation. **St. Dominic Savio Catholic High School** will be a diocesan high school, rooted in the Catholic tradition. Its academic, athletic and extracurricular program will challenge students to go beyond excellence, to reflect on the needs of others, to be committed to faith, and to become leaders.

Bishop Gregory Aymond has created a vibrant vision for the future of Catholic education in the Diocese of Austin. His plan for a new diocesan Catholic high school fulfills the dream of families to have an alternative to public and private schools. The new high school is a diocesan priority and will manifest a Catholic and Christ-centered mission with visionary leadership.

The school will be the first Catholic high school in north Austin. St. Dominic Savio is being built to support the tremendous population growth in Travis and Williamson counties. It will be fiscally sound, affordable, accessible and accountable.

This is an exceptional opportunity for the Catholic Church in Central Texas.

A co-educational, college preparatory school, St. Dominic Savio Catholic High School will be a school for leaders that will instill Catholic values while providing a moral and ethical foundation to begin their adult life.


St. Dominic Savio Catholic High School will be exemplary in terms of learning opportunities, experiences and amenities, Extracurricular activities

and athletic programs will round out a holistic educational experience for students.

- St. Dominic Savio Catholic High School will offer a strong Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) curriculum.
- St. Dominic Savio is designed to accommodate 750 students. Phase I will have the capacity for 300 students.
- St. Dominic Savio will open in the fall of 2009 with a freshman class. An additional grade will be added in each of the following three years.

The school will be located on a 45-acre tract off Neenah Avenue, east of Parmer Lane and adjacent to Holy Family Catholic School and St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church. Phase I will contain 83,690 square feet and 13 classrooms, as well as a self-standing cafetorium, a gymnasium, and a band and choral suite.

Work is proceeding on construction drawings, Neenah Avenue extension, technology master plan, annexation of the 45-acre tract, hiring a principal, development of staffing plans and establishment of an endowment fund for tuition assistance and scholarships.





OUR CHILDREN, OUR FUTURE

Our children will provide the energy and leadership needed by our Church and our nation as we move into an ever-changing and challenging future.

The Institute of Education Science at the U.S. Department of Education found that:

- Catholic school students generally perform higher than their public school counterparts on standardized achievement tests;
- Catholic school graduates are more likely to have completed advanced-level courses;
- Catholic high schools typically have more demanding graduation requirements;
- Catholic school students are more likely to complete a bachelor's or advanced degree by their mid-20s.

CAMPAIGN GOAL

The goal of the **"Today's Gifts: Tomorrow's Hope"** capital campaign is to build Phase I of the project, an endowment fund for tuition assistance and scholarships and funds required for the pre-opening operating costs and operating deficits in the initial years of operation.

Completion of buildings and move into facility: Fall of 2009
